Hi Mike,

I was able to get some clarification, per Costa Mesa Municipal Code Title 13, Chapter 4, Section 30 it appears that garage sales are not permitted in many of the areas outside of residential zones. The fair grounds do not fall under residential zones and a business license will be required per Costa Mesa Municipal Code Title 9, Chapter 2, Article 1, Section 114. Regarding the Seller's Permit please reach out to the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration for more calcification if it is required to obtain a Seller's Permit.

Good afternoon,

I am one of the directors of a festival called the Orange County Sustainability Decathlon that will be hosted at OC Fair & Event Center this Oct 5-15. The main attraction of the festival will be 14 highly sustainable, ultra efficient model homes designed and built by collegiate teams of architecture and engineering students. 10 teams are from California schools; the other 4 are from Virginia, Tennesse, Utah, and China. The models homes will be temporarily located in a parking lot at OCFEC during the festival and will be evaluated and open to the public during that time.

I am writing to ask whether we or our collegiate teams are required to apply for business licenses

### for any of the following types of transactions some teams may be conducting on site:

- 1. Selling or giving away the model home to a festival attendee
- 2. Selling or giving away "loose" model home components the team doesn't want to bother transporting back to their home campuses and/or doesn't want to have end up in a landfill
- 3. Selling or giving away "SWAG" items as a project fundraising activity
- 4. Selling symbolic sponsorships of home components, e.g., \$10 to "buy a tile" or "sponsor a cell"
- 5. Selling one-on-one consultation sessions with festival attendees who want the team's sustainable living, home remodeling, and/or home design advice.

The OC Sustainability Decathlon is a program sponsored by Charitable Ventures of Orange County, a 501(c)3 fiscal sponsor. Most of the program funding comes from the California Natural Resources Agency (CNRA). The program has also received some targeted funding from the City of Costa Mesa, City of Irvine, and County of Orange. Our teams operate as formal or informal "clubs" within their respective collegiate institutions, most or all of which are nonprofits. Each team has received \$100k of seed funding from CNRA via Charitable Ventures. Salem Afeworki (copied) is the Division Manager for Energy and Sustainability Services of Costa Mesa and will serve as one of our project evaluation jurors, so she is very familiar with our program in case you want someone within CM city government who can offer further context.
